>This work may be performed by three solo voices, a small ensemble, or female chorus.

>The entire work may be transposed. If one movement is transposed, all movements *must* be similarly transposed, so that each begins on an inversion of the same major triad.

>Tempi are flexible and phrasing rubato.

>Each movement is slightly slower than the preceding.

>The rhythmic feel should be elastic but clearly syncopated, with notably stronger emphasis given to downbeats and audibly less to upbeats.

>Quarter rests at the ends of phrases represent ensemble breaths and may be performed longer or shorter at the performers' discretion

>Movements may be performed together or separated within a concert; however, the composer requests all three be performed in order whether integrally or interspersed.
